3.5	RS welcomed the progress and emphasised the importance of local group involvement for funding and implementation.	
<b>4.</b>	<b>Current issues</b>	
4.1	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• A community-led group will guide the direction of the project, with input from local communities.</li> <li>• The outcome of <i>Dunardry Day</i> should inform potential future uses and opportunities.</li> <li>• Local mapping of views and usage will be essential.</li> <li>• NMacN noted that the Cairnbaan Community Trust (CCT) has previous engagement experience and could potentially host related content on its website (subject to group formation outcomes).</li> </ul>	
4.2	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Funding opportunities and application processes were discussed.</li> <li>• CoC highlighted multiple potential funding sources.</li> <li>• SC to prepare and circulate a list of relevant funders to the group by end of August.</li> <li>• IMacN supported the idea that CCT could serve as a vehicle for funding applications, if the working group operates under its umbrella.</li> </ul>	<b>SC</b>
4.3	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Concerns were raised about the impact of the bridge closure on canal crossing. These concerns will be discussed in more detail at the <i>Dunardry Day</i> follow-up meeting.</li> </ul>	
4.4	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• RS raised traffic concerns on the towpath.</li> <li>• Previous suggestions to reduce speed limits on adjacent roads were met with resistance from the local authority (A&amp;BC).</li> </ul>	

4.5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>DP noted the potential need to manage conflicting views within the community regarding the project's direction.</li> </ul>	
4.6	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>MS asked about bridge operation and the role automation might play.</li> <li>CoC confirmed that Scottish Canals' Lowlands Team has relevant automation experience. SC to provide examples.</li> <li>Discussion on bridge operation to be part of <i>Dunardry Day</i>; SC will invite Engineering and Operations teams.</li> <li>RS highlighted operational challenges at Crinan Bridge; relevant lessons to be incorporated into planning.</li> </ul>	<b>SC</b>
<b>5.</b>	<b>Historic Environment Scotland</b>	
5.1	Community feedback must be considered in the context of the bridge's historic significance.	
5.2	The potential for automation was discussed. Similar heritage bridges have been successfully mechanised, offering safety benefits.	
5.3	SC to extend an invitation to HES to attend <i>Dunardry Day</i> .	<b>SC</b>
